

Daniël Cuypers is full professor at the University of Antwerp. He studied Law in Antwerp and Leuven. Afterwards he was a fellow at the DAAD (Germany) and in Cambridge (British Council). From 1981 to 1991 he was a lawyer (patron Thierry Claeys). From 1981 he was first part-time, later full-time assistant. Graduated in law (KUL) in 1989 with a dissertation on “Abuse of dismissal law and arbitrary dismissal”. Since 1989 he has been charged with 16 different teaching assignments in various faculties of the University of Antwerp and with various internal mandates. (including academic secretary; vice-dean; member of the Rectoral Council and the General Meeting of Shareholders of the non-profit association UFSIA; member of the UA Education Council (2002-2018) and of various research councils. He was a member of the Council for Disputes on Study Progress Decisions from 2008 to 2017. His research covers various topics in Individual Employment Law, Fundamental Social Rights, OCMW Law, Discrimination Law and Education Law. He is the author of 262 publications, reports and opinion pieces in and editor of the Tijdschrift voor Sociale Recht, the Socialrechtelijke Kronieken and the Tijdschrift voor Onderwijsrecht en policy.
